Ariel's Laguna Glaze Mixes

*(AB) Indicates a new glaze created by Ariel by mixing Laguna glazes together or adding stains to them.

Equal Part Ratio Mixes

These recipes are designed to be mixed in equal ratio by liquid volume. This means using measuring cups and mixing glazes 1:1 or 2:1, etc. For example, to make Desert Sand (1:1 ratio snowflake: sandy) mix ½ cup sandy with ½ cup snowflake. Use any measuring cup size you like, just make sure its equal!

Golden Brown (AB) – warm toasted brown, flat color, softens textures

2 Lemon Yellow: 1 Tobacco

Mocha (AB) – rich burnt sienna, variegated, breaks on textures

1 Ochre: 1 Tobacco

Okapi (AB) – warm black brown, breaks on textures

1 Golden Brown (AB): 1 Sting Ray (AB)

Desert Sand (AB) – soft light tan with purple-gray hues, softens textures

1 Sandy Matte: 1 Snowflake

Buckskin (AB) – warm tawny gold, variegated, breaks on textures

1 Ochre: 1 Sandy Matte

Mason Stain Mixes

These recipes use a percentage of mason stain added to the liquid volume of a glaze. A digital gram scale is needed for weighing out liquid glazes. Generally $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon of mason stain equals 1% or 1 gram.

Sting Ray (AB) Sage (200g wet) + 5% Mason Stain Best Black 6600

Shark Skin (AB) Snowflake (200g wet) + 3% Mason Stain Best Black 6600 (Use less stain for a lighter gray color if desired)

Yellowstone (AB) Lemon Yellow (200g Wet) + 10-12% Rutile Stain

Dove Gray (AB) Snowflake (200g wet) +10% Pearl Gray

Note: Snowflake is a great base glaze for adding any stain, test it first!

Ariel's Laguna Glaze Layers

These colors are made using one coat of each glaze in order, the individual colors blend together in the kiln when applied in layers. For example, to get Light Gray Brown apply one coat of Bamboo Ash and one coat of Sandy Matte. It usually takes two coats of the Laguna glazes on their own to achieve the right surface, so when layering only use one coat of each glaze. Underglazes and stains can also be used to enhance and add depth to these glaze layers. This is a great thing to do to hide clay color peeking through when glaze breaks on texture as well.

Warm Brown (bears, dogs) Sandy + Fern Mist

Dark Blue Gray (whales, cattle, cats) Sting Ray (AB) + Dark Turquoise

Textured Green Gray (rhinos, pachyderms) Medium gray underglaze mix + Dark Blue Sand Dry Stain wash + Sage + Agate

Textured Blue Gray (elephants) Gray brown underglaze mix + Agate + Dove Gray or + Elephant Hide

Light Gray Brown (wolves, hyenas) Bamboo Ash + Sandy Matte

Speckled Black (sea creatures, cats, horses) Dark Turquoise + Sting Ray (AB)

Bright Turquoise (fish, birds, reptiles) Fern Mist + Snowflake

Warm Tortoise Shell Brown (cats, dogs, deer, reptiles) Bamboo Ash + Agate

Mottled Tawny Brown (cats, dogs, antelope) Bamboo Ash + Fern Mist

Notes on Application:

- I always brush my glazes on in 1-2 good coats depending on glaze consistency. This works best if you are layering glazes, using multiple colors and painting animal markings.
- Some of the laguna glazes come thicker in the jar and I don't add much water so I can use just one heavy coat, or 2 coats if I am using 2 glazes and layering them. If you thin them out more with water you should do 2-3 coats to get the best results.
- Sometimes the laguna glazes can have low brushability. I dip my brush in water then the glaze if I need them to flow better across the surface or fill in deep textures.

Base Recipe

Gerstley Borate	50
Nepheline Syenite	15
Alumina Hydrate	35
Total	100g

For different colors add colorant combinations listed below

Dark Green: 10% Copper Carb, 5% Iron Chromate

Light Brown: 7.5% Iron Chromate

Turquoise: 3% Copper Carb

Chestnut Brown: 10% Red Iron Oxide, 5% Manganese

Dark Blue: 2% Copper Carb, 2% Cobalt Carb, 1% Iron Chromate

Notes: I like Chestnut Brown best; it is very dark brown/black in color and great at accentuating textures with high contrast. All these stains are very dry in appearance and pool into texture. They are best when brushed on and sponged off the high points of the surface. I also like Dark Blue, especially for layering with the Laguna Glazes. Make sure to apply them in a thin layer or sponge them off. If they are too thick, they can really affect the color of glazes or underglazes on top.

Warning: These stains do not work well with the Amaco Satin Matte cone 5-6 glazes; it causes them to peel away in places. Also, most of these stains contain harmful chemicals such as manganese that should not be absorbed by the skin, wear gloves when sponging and applying.

^{*}This is the firing schedule I use for ALL my sculptures. It creates micro-crystal growth in the Laguna glazes that makes them extra matte and glittery up close.
